The 2023 Great Performers Series opens with the renowned **Emerson String** Quartet (January 30, 2023 at Riverview Performing Arts Center), performing in Sarasota as part of their farewell concert tour and presenting musical highlights of their 47-year history. Pianist Awadagin Pratt brings his artistry to the Riverview Performing Arts Center (February 15, 2023) with a varied program of works, from Philip Glass to Rachmaninoff and Liszt.

In his final season as Music Director, Riccardo Muti brings the internationallyacclaimed Chicago Symphony Orchestra to Sarasota for one night only (March 1, 2023 at Van Wezel Performing Arts Hall) in a program that includes Beethoven's Symphony No. 8 and Mussorgsky's Pictures at an Exhibition. The English Chamber Orchestra, one of the

most recorded chamber orchestras in the world, takes center stage (March 12, 2023 at Van Wezel Performing Arts Hall) in a program that includes Elgar, Mozart and Haydn.

Concluding the 2023 Great Performers Series, Music Director JoAnn Falletta returns to Sarasota with the **Buffalo Philharmonic** (March 27 at Van Wezel Performing Arts Hall) in a program that includes Mendelssohn's Violin Concerto and Dvořák's Symphony No. 7.

Sarasota Opera House). The Sarasota Concert Association will also present the National
